CIRCULAR

Subject: Exemptions/Concessions extend to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for Class X and XII Examination conducted by BSB and Standard Operating Procedure(s).

Bhartiya Shiksha Board being sensitive to the needs of disabled students is extending several exemptions/concessions to candidates with disabilities as defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act - 2016.

The Bhartiya Shiksha Board has compiled all the exemptions/ concessions to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for Class X and Class XII examinations, so that stakeholders are aware about the same and also the schools may adopt the proper procedure for seeking the exemptions for their students.

Please find herewith consolidated exemptions/concessions along with Standard Operation Procedures for seeking exemptions.

These exemptions/concessions will be applicable for the 2025 examination onwards.

EXEMPTIONS/ CONCESSIONS RULES APPLICABLE FOR BOTH CLASS X & XII BOARD EXAM

A. GENERAL EXEMPTIONS/ CONCESSIONS

Issuing Authority of Medical Certificate	The medical certificate issued by the following agencies/organizations will be considered for granting concessions to Disabled candidates: (i) Disability Certificate(s) issued by Government hospitals controlled by either the Central or State Governments from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon /Medical Superintendent. (ii) Disability Certificate(s) issued by Recognized institutes of national level viz National Association for the Blind, Spastic Society of India etc; and (iii) Disability Certificate(s) issued by Non-governmental Organizations/practitioners registered with Rehabilitation Council of India/Central Government/State Government of the Respective State. (iv) The disability certificate issued by the competent authority at any place shall be accepted. (v) The proforma of the certificate regarding physical limitation for an examinee to write is annexed at Annexure-I.

Facility of Scribe and compensatory time	(i) Candidates with disabilities as defined in The Rights of Persons With Disabilities Act 2016 are permitted to use a Scribe or allowed Compensatory time as given below or both: For paper of 3 hours duration 60 minutes For paper of 2½ hours duration 50 minutes For paper of 2 hours duration 40 minutes For paper of 1½ hours duration 30 minutes (ii) For categories of disabilities for which scribe/ reader/ writer/ adult prompter is permissible please refer to the Annexure -III.

2.	Flexibility in choosing subjects	(a) Candidates with disabilities as defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 have the option of studying one compulsory language as against two. This language should be in consonance with the overall spirit of the Three Language Formula prescribed by the Board. Besides one language any four from amongst the following groups can be offered: Mathematics, Science, Social Science, another language, Music (Any one), Painting, Home Science, any one skill subject.					
		(b) Physio – therapic exercises are considered as equivalent to Health and Physical Education course of the Board.

Disabled candidates are given separate question papers containing Multiple choice questions based on Practical component in lieu of practicals in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry and Biology b. Students studying in schools affiliated to the Board and desirous of availing the exemptions/concessions should approach the CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATION, BSB through the Head of their Institution preferably while in Class IX and/or XI. The request should be supported by relevant medical certificate and recommendation from the Head of the School/Institution. Only

those students would be considered for grant of exemption/concession in whose respect relevant category has been entered during registration in Class IX and/or XI.

Advisory to schools as per the Guidelines of Inclusive Education of Children with Disabilities (IECD):

- a. Ensure that no child with special needs is denied admission in Mainstream Education
- b. Monitor enrolment of disabled children in schools
- c. Schools to provide support through assistive devices and the availability of trained teachers
- Modify the existing physical infrastructure and teaching methodologies to meet the needs
 of all children including Children with Special Needs
- Ensure that the school premises are made disabled friendly by 2023 and all educational institutions including hostels, libraries, laboratories and buildings have barrier free access for the disabled
- f. Ensure availability of Study material for the disabled and Talking Text Books, Reading Machines and Computers with speech software
- g. Ensure adequate number of Study material for the disabled and Talking Text Books, Reading Machines and computers with speech software
- h. Revisit Classroom organization required for the education of Children with Special Needs
- Ensure regular in service training of teachers in inclusive education at the elementary and secondary level.

CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATIONS

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR AVAILING EXEMPTIONS

STEP 1: Parents go through the consolidated instructions issued by BSB.

STEP II: Parents get the child examined by the Competent Medical Authority and obtain requisite Medical Certificate of Disability.

STEP III: For availing any exemptions, parents will have to make a request to school along with copy of certificate of disability. The draft application is annexed at **Annexure-IV**. School will acknowledge the request made by the candidate.

STEP IV: School will forward the request to Controller of Examinations of the Board, along with specific recommendation. In case of rejection by the school, the same should also be sent to Board along with reasons of such rejection.

STEP V: The office will examine the request in accordance with the rules of the Board. In case of rejection, reasons for the same will be intimated.
